- 2. Integrated Plan Approval– Karissa Morehouse (Consultation)
 - a. A few changes still need to be made before submission to the Chancellor's Office in January.
 - b. Academic senate reviewed it and gave helpful feedback
 - i. Discrepancy in our data: Veterans were at 7% on the equity plan and now it says 4% in the integrated plan. Are we double dipping incarcerated veterans? No. We don't get paid any differently for veterans students; this data includes any student who self-identifies as a veteran at time of application to Lassen College.
 - ii. There is discussion about requiring Math Lab instead of it being an option for students.
 - iii. The Steps to Success certificates needed to be included in noncredit certificates as does the new automotive noncredit certificates that was just approved at Curriculum.

- 1. Dr. Hall wants to apologize for not getting to formally introducing Dr. Taylor. He was out of town due to family loss on Dec. 1, 2017, the day she started
- 2. Andy Rupley is concerned with books that were just bought that are not going to be used now with OER
 - a. Cheryl suggested implementing a couple of classes at a time rather than moving all business classes at once.
 - b. Also the printing of these OER books is a concern-students need access to printed copies if they want one.
 - c. E-readers currently in use at California Correctional Center and High Desert State Prison have very limited ability because of freezing & memory issues. CDCR went for the lowest bid but is now investing in tablets.
- 3. Karissa reported that there will be an OER meeting next Wednesday, December 13, 2017 from 4:00pm-5:30pm in CA209. Dinner will be served. The focus of the meeting is to continue collaborating and to discuss policies and procedures that might need to implemented

- 4. Cheryl shared that there have been questions asked about security cameras in use on campus even though the policy hasn't been developed or approved yet. IT Planning Committee is working on a draft BP and AP; David Corley and Chrisdee Pelfrey will share them with Consultation Council later this month.
 - a. What are the new cameras around campus?
 - i. They came in after the theft a few years ago
 - 1. There are signs up
 - ii. Employees are concerned about what these cameras are for
 - 1. Safety, theft, or employee performance?
 - a. If it is for employee performance a notice **has** to be given
 - b. They are primarily for "after the fact" evidence (90%)
 - c. They are concerned that the cameras are in place before the policy is in place
 - d. It is primarily a nighttime piece.
 - e. They could be used if there was an employee involvement in an altercation but not performance until policy and notice is given
 - iii. Greg, Chrisdee, and David Corley can access them
 - iv. Do they record 24/7? Some do but some are only after5:00pm

 - a. It was a great facilitated discussion
 - b. Edoptics will be back on campus in January
