  - Share the charges with their committees and bring them back in January. There was a concern about the charges not being correct. Cheryl asked to get information and concerns to her. Cheryl reminded the group that committees need to be meeting at least once a month. They need to be regularly scheduled and in the calendar.
- 7. Prioritization Spreadsheet Quarterly Update (Information) Dave Clausen Things that are in green are approved and moving forward. GFI came in over budget. It was originally projected to be \$75,000 and it came in at \$156,000. Single mode fiber came in under budget at \$20,000 vs \$75,000. Our wells are moving forward, they were brushed and videoed. They are strong and the psi is strong after the brushing. There are four testing sights in a few of our buildings, this is so an outside company can come test and we can easily do our tests that are required every four weeks. We are going to be testing the wells, even though it is not required. It is the quickest way to know about an issue. It will be a year before we get our permit in hand. In January we will get our permission to switch. It was projected to run us \$150,000 a year at one point if we did not use our own wells. Working on out of state/non-resident fees. Shasta is about \$22 lower so Dave is looking into it to see if we could keep ours lower also to be competitive. Did we stick to priority list? For the most part we did, except for staffing because they were brought up later but needed quickly, like nursing assistant. Where are we sitting right now with FDS. Dave said we need to wait for numbers, we are down a little on numbers right now from looking at the fall enrollments. How many senior citizens did we lose since we took out the scholarship? It seems to have not really effected our numbers. It will really be contingent on the BOG. The BOG is not changing, only its name is changing this summer 2018. We are waiting to see what the CCCCG is going to be. Our enrollments might go up better with dual enrollments with the high school and our incarcerated students. Student debt is harder to collect this year, Our workstudy numbers are down also. Payment plans are not working out as well as we were hoping. If they need a payment plan, they need to qualify for work-study. We will have Nina at orientation to directly talk to EOPS students about workstudy jobs and their benefits. Also, have Nina talk to Dave Clausen about workstudy jobs that are available. We had a clean audit except for one issue. Very good job and thank you from David Clausen.
