- 2. Demonstrate an understanding of the formative influence of the various periods of art upon our own cultural environment.
- 3. Name and identify characteristics of certain historically significant art works.

Assigned reading in the text and other readings assigned by instructor.

Three written assignments about the life, time, and work of three specific artists in which the student will assess and make critical judgements about that period of art and the specific artists work.

Independent research for papers and reading textbook.

D. Specific Assignments that Demonstrate Critical Thinking

Students will be expected to make verbal and/or written judgements and critiques about art within the time frame studied

Traditional Classroom Delivery

Lecture, discussion, audio-visual media, illustrated lectures, group critiques and other appropriate methods.

Hybrid Delivery

A combination of traditional classroom and online instruction will be utilized. Each semester a minimum of 17 hours, or 1/3 of the lecture hours, will be taught face-to face by the instructor and the remaining hours will be instructed online through the technology platform adopted by the District. Traditional class instruction will consist of exercises/assignments, lectures, visual aids, and practice exercises. Online delivery will consist of exercises/assignments, lecture posts, discussions, adding extra resources and other media sources as appropriate.

Online Delivery

Participation in forum-based discussions. Online exercises/assignments contained on website. Web based video vignettes with discussion paper, email communications, postings to forums, online lecture notes and web links will compromise the method of instruction.
